Furniture for all 10-units is anticipated to be delivered in January with a plan to open the units in February 2025! Four units are for HRRMC outpatients, their families or caregivers, who live 30-plus miles from Salida.

DELNAY & HYLTON DONATIONS MAKE GUEST HOUSE A REALITY

Robert and Bernice Delnay retired in Salida in the 1980's. They realized the importance of a thriving healthcare system and named HRRMC Foundation in their estate. Their generous donation of \$1.5 million allowed for the construction of four hospitality units and six short-term rentals for HRRMC employees.

When Picie Hylton, a 30-year owner of Hylton Lumber, passed in 1997, he had a dream to build a hospice house in Salida. Hylton House revived that dream in 2020 and ensured accommodations would be free to HRRMC patients, family members, and caregivers, as well as for families of hospice patients coming to Salida. The Picie Hylton Charitable Fund covers operational costs for the four hospitality units.

MARY ANN BANACH WOUND CARE CENTER

The HRRMC Board of Directors approved the Mary Ann Banach Wound Care Center at their September 2024 board meeting. The wound care center will be housed in the main building at HRRMC, behind the front registration desk, and will include a hyperbaric chamber, with a second chamber room ready as the service grows and shows a need for two.



The HRRMC Foundation Board designated over \$468,000 towards the Wound Care Center, with \$363,000 coming from Mary Ann Banach's estate.

2024 HALL OF FAME BARBARA WILLIAMS ALLENDER



HRRMC Foundation is pleased to honor Barbara Williams Allender, a Salida native who graduated as valedictorian of her high school class in 1955. After receiving her nursing degree, she returned home and became a surgical nurse at Denver & Rio Grande Hospital (which eventually became HRRMC). Barbara became Director of Nursing in 1972 and oversaw many changes including updated sterilization practices, established the coronary care room, and created home care services for discharged patients. Barbara had a significant impact on many careers at HRRMC. She served in other capacities until her official retirement in 2008.
